## ARPC AND PAC

A R P The American Radon Policy Campaign supports federal and state-level lobbying activity and is funded by a growing group of committed ARPC advertisers. The American Radon Policy Campaign (ARPC) was created to convince key federal policymakers to provide leadership in protecting people from radon exposure. Since 2013, the ARPC Advertisers program has been the mechanism through which AARST members purchase advertising to support AARST's government affairs work. All contributions to ARPC Advertisers are tax-deductible business expenses.

P A Contribute campaign funds to candidates who support policies to reduce radon-induced lung cancer. AARST has established a Political Action Committee (PAC) for the benefit of the membership, to help elect political candidates who understand and appreciate the need for federal policies to reduce risk of radon-induced lung cancer. Having a PAC elevates AARST's status as a policy advocate in Washington DC and in state capitals. The PAC gives AARST a political capability to complement its congressional, federal agency, and state legislative

advocacy capabilities.


