





2 years later...

- Almost half of Iowa's schools have tested for radon, with a steady rate of 15% of buildings needing mitigation.
- That's about 200 school buildings that have or will need a licensed radon mitigation professional to mitigate for radon.
- And... that's over half a million students, 36,000 teachers, and countless other administrative and support staff who will **not** be exposed to radon at school and work.
